## **Regional Opportunities:**

**Rocky Mountain Power Grants:** As the philanthropic arm of Rocky Mountain Power, the Foundation of the same name serves the growth and vitality of communities in Utah, Wyoming, and Southeastern Idaho. The Foundation limits its grants to charitable organizations with 501(c)3 tax-exemption status, but eligibility is further restricted to programs listed below: Click Here

- Educational and research organizations both public and private, from early childhood through university level (proposals due March 15)
- Environment, civic and community enhancement and other organizations not covered in other categories (due June 15)
- Arts and culture organizations dedicated to performing arts, visual arts, historic preservation, cross-cultural education and related (due September 15)
- Health, safety, and wellness organizations including youth organizations, senior citizen centers, dependency and prevention programs and related (due December 15)

Amount: \$2,000-\$5,000 Deadline: Varies, see above

#### State-Wide:

**George S. and Dolores Dore Eccles Foundation:** Five categories: Arts and Culture to Preservation and Conservation. Foundation gifts are directed to eligible charitable organizations that will provide a variety of services. Click Here

Walmart Community Programs: Walmart Foundation's key areas of focus, Sustainability, Opportunity, Community and Racial Equality. **R.A.M.P (Weber County Utah):** Funds for qualifying city and county entities and non-profit organizations operating publicly owned facilities within Weber County will be made available under Major Projects on the basis of a formal application. Click Here

**Community Development Grants:** This program provides affordable funding to develop essential community facilities in rural areas. An essential community facility is defined as a facility that provides an essential service to the local community for the orderly development of the community in a primarily rural area. Click Here

**Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant:** The project will enhance recreational opportunities and amenities in Utah's communities. The built recreational infrastructure must provide an economic opportunity for the local area with the ability to increase visitation, boost local businesses, and/or attract and retain residents. Click Here

Amount: \$15,001-\$200,000.

Deadline: March 17

**R. Harold Burton Foundation:** Grant proposals are considered from established tax-exempt organizations and institutions whose purposes are charitable or educational, primarily established in the greater Salt Lake metropolitan area. Applicant organizations must have a 501(c)(3) non-profit tax-exempt status to be eligible to apply. The Board will consider all eligible proposals. Click Here

Christopher and Dana Reeve Quality of Life Grant: The Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation funds a variety of programs that meet one of the three key areas of priority funding: Actively Achieving, Bridging Barriers, or Caring and Coping. Non-profit organizations, municipal governments, school districts, tribal entities, or community organizations. Applicants should show proof of providing individuals with disabilities opportunities to participate in activities that engage both the body and mind. These activities should include personal growth and nurture independence. Click Here

**Shade Structure Grant:** The American Academy of Dermatology's (AAD) Shade Structure Program awards funds to schools, day-cares, parks, and other non-profit organizations for installing permanent shade structures where children learn and play. Click Here

**T-Mobile:** Must be shovel-ready and include plans, budget, timeline, anticipated impact, and up to five letters of support. Elected officials, town managers/employees, tribal leaders, or nonprofit community leaders from small towns with population less than 50,000 can apply. Eligible projects include technology upgrades, outdoor spaces, the arts, and community centers. Click Here
